Parent Association Meeting - 7pm Monday 4th August

As Year 4 become more confident using their iPads to support their learning, the question of "Where to next?" arises. The iLean Project provided Year 4 students with the iPad they will use through to Year 6. How can we provide 2015 Year 4 & 6's with the same opportunity?

While the school will always provide a core number of iPads for each class, it is not financially viable to fund a 1:1 program. The alternative, which a number of primary schools and most secondary schools have adopted, is "bring your own device" (BYOD).

There are many issues that need to be considered before we go down that path, and we invite all parents to attend the Parent Association Meeting where this topic will be discussed. Once a decision is made, it will impact on all students as they progress through the school, so make your voice heard, bring your questions, as a BYOD program is only successful when parents and the school work in partnership. If you are unable to attend, please feel free to send in your thoughts for consideration.

Uniform and Grooming

At St Joseph's, we have an all season uniform to minimise school expenses for families.

Our school colours are dark blue and yellow, so T-shirts/skivvies under blouses/shirts, jumpers, jackets, hats and socks need to be either dark blue or yellow. School shoes are black, not joggers.

Socks need to be folded over ankles, not anklets that disappear in shoes. Our uniform requirements are not onerous; please support us in students taking pride in our school.

While hair fashions come and go, long hair must be tied back with dark blue or yellow bands, clips, scrunchies, ribbons, etc. While each child likes to express their individuality, being in uniform at school also provides a sense of belonging. Extreme hairstyles do little to enhance a child's sense of self. Do we really want our child to stand out in the crowd for what is a passing fad? Please consider!

Nail polish and jewellery is not for school. signet rings, sleeper earrings, studs and chains with a cross or medal are acceptable. We recommend chains be worn under the uniform so as to minimise breakage.
