NAPLAN

Next week, students in Years 3 and 5 will undertake assessments in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy, known as NAPLAN.

Why do students do NAPLAN tests?

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

How can I help my child prepare for NAPLAN?

Help your child prepare for NAPLAN by reassuring them that the tests are just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Teachers have been ensuring students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance. NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress.

What if my child is absent from school on test days?

Where possible, we may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the testing week. Individual students are not permitted to sit tests after Friday 18 May 2018. Please contact your child's teacher if you are aware they will be absent for one or more days during NAPLAN week.

How is my child's performance measured?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each test. The performance of individual students can be compared to the average performance of all students in Australia. A NAPLAN report will be issued later in the year.

How are NAPLAN test results used?

- Students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help them better identify students who require greater challenges or additional support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and weaknesses in teaching programs and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review programs and support offered to schools.

Head Lice Notification

The school has been advised by several parents that nits/head lice have been present in their child's hair. If you notice your child has head lice please advise the school on the first outbreak so we can send out a notification to parents.

Please check your child's hair for nits/lice tonight. If you find any eggs or lice please commence treatment as recommended.

Time from infestation to eggs hatching: Usually 7-10 days

Symptoms: Itchy scalp, white specks near the base of the hairs, lice may be found on the scalp.

How can I prevent spread? Family, friends and classroom contacts should be examined and treated if infested. Clothing and bedding should be washed in hot water.

Tips for parents in reducing the spread of head lice

As infestations are particularly common in primary schools, it is best to choose a treatment that can be used over time. There is no single solution to eradication, only persistence.

- regularly check your children's hair
- teach older children to check their own hair
- tie back and braid long hair
- keep a fine tooth head lice comb in the bathroom and encourage all family members to use it when they wash their hair.

Removing head lice and nits

You'll need:

- a bottle of cheap hair conditioner
- a towel
- a thick tooth comb
- a fine tooth comb
- a roll of paper towels.

STEPS:

- Sit your child on a chair or stool in front of you. Wrap a towel around their shoulders to catch conditioner spill. (You may want to put a video or TV show on, as this process can take a while.)
- Apply a cheap, pale coloured conditioner generously to your child's hair. Work it through to coat every strand of hair. For long hair, it may be easier to tie one side of the hair off, and work in sections.
- Head lice breathe through small openings along their abdomens. By coating the hair and therefore the louse in something thick and slimy, these openings close over, shutting down the louse's breathing for about 20 minutes long enough for them to stay still and be combed out.
- After you've applied the conditioner, **use a large comb to part small sections of the hair**, starting from the nape and working upwards toward the crown.
- When the hair is detangled and manageable, use a fine lice comb and run through each section several times. Eggs are often found behind the ears and toward the back of the head. By combing from the bottom of the back of the head up, towards the top and front of the head, you're more likely to find the head lice.
- After each comb out, wipe the conditioner on the paper towel. If your child has head lice, you will see them on the towel (they're a little like small, brown, chia or sesame seeds.)
- **Keep combing each section** of hair until no further lice or eggs appear on the paper towel. Often you will see lots of old egg casings that may take a while to remove.
- Once you have combed and re-combed each section of hair, either re-plait or tie it back if it's long enough.
- Head lice often congregate on the crown of the head, so it's not until you reach these last sections of hair that you'll find adult lice. However, heads that are severely infected will have adult lice everywhere.
- Repeat at least twice over the next few days, until you can't find any more in the conditioner. You'll never be able to get all the head lice and eggs out the first time. However, in the days after your first treatment, the eggs will hatch and you'll be able to catch the crawling nymphs (young lice).


Learning Matters

Multiplicative Thinking

It is an exciting time at St Josephs during Term 2. Teachers are exploring the links between current classroom practice and teacher understanding of the difficult transitions in multiplicative thinking.

Multiplicative Thinking is characterised by:

- A capacity to work flexibly and efficiently with an extended range of numbers (for example, larger whole numbers, decimals, common fractions, ratio and percent)
- An ability to recognise and solve a range of problems involving multiplication or division including direct and indirect proportion
- The means to communicate this effectively in a variety of ways (for example, words, diagrams, symbolic expressions and written algorithms)
- Students will be involved in various activities during their numeracy lessons throughout the year to help them gain a better understanding of using Maths in everyday life.



Homework

Each class has access to homework through either Google Classroom or on sheets that have been sent home. This homework is voluntary as families have many other commitments that make time for homework difficult. Please speak to your child about their homework. If you have further questions make a time to speak to your child's teacher.

Defibrillator

St Joseph's now has a defibrillator located in the administration office. All staff are trained yearly in CPR and know how to use this equipment. If you are at the school and notice someone has taken ill and may need CPR please contact the office immediately.


