Dear Parents and Carers.

As we draw to the end of Lent, we remember and reflect on the passion and death of Jesus and celebrate with joy and hope, His resurrection at Easter. Alleluia! Alleluia!

This week, children joined in prayerful reflection in the re-enactments of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Jesus washing the feet of His disciples at the Last Supper, and Jesus' long walk to Calvary and death on the Cross. Tomorrow, children will "wait at the tomb," in prayerful reflection led by our Year 6 students who also led each class through the Stations of the Cross today. This week is the pinnacle of our Christian faith, a faith based on Christ's death and Resurrection, faith based on the Risen Christ who made the Father and Spirit known to us. Participate this week in your church and renew your faith to better support your child's life journey. Faith brings Hope!

This year we commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the landing at Gallipoli. ANZAC Day commemorations are already underway, e.g. POPPY PARK. We have also been invited to participate in St Mary's RSL Sub-Branch ANZAC Sunday Service at Victoria Park on Sunday 19th April. Students in school uniform, are invited assemble behind our school banner at 2pm for the 2.30pm march from Coachmans Park (opposite Westpac St Marys) to Victoria Park (opposite the Band Club on the Great Western Highway). The ceremony at Victoria Park is expected to begin at 2.45pm, and we will place crosses that our Year 6 students have decorated, as part of the WW1 Centenary Project - "St Marys Served Australia in WW1". This event is on the last Sunday of the holidays. Families welcome!

On Friday 24th April, we will be holding our school ANZAC ceremony at 10.30am in front of our flagpole near the Year 3 & 4 building. To honour the fallen service men and women of our extended school families, we ask you to complete the attached form and return to school by Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April. We will include these in our Remembrance Garden which will be blessed by Fr Andrew Fornal OP, and we will officially open with a planting of an ANZAC Rose as part of our school ANZAC Centenary commemoration. Everyone is invited!

May you all have a holy and happy Easter and stay safe during the holidays.

#### Holv Week

This week we are remembering the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus.

On Tuesday, Year 5 helped us to remember Palm Sunday, the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Our younger students joyfully waved their palms to announce the coming of the messiah. A huge thank you to all involved in such a prayerful experience.

Wednesday, Year 6 led the school in the Stations of the Cross. Classes walked around the school grounds as Year 6 students recreated each station.

Thursday, classes will spend time in prayer as they gather before the tomb. This will allow students to reflect on the sacrifice made by Jesus as he went to his death.

In preparing for the Stations of the Cross, Year 6 students were asked to reflect on their role and what it would have been like to be there. The following is from Lucie Coulter from 6ET, who portrayed Mary.

"As I am Mary I see my son Jesus dragging that horrible, heavy cross up the sharp rocky hill. I see my gentle, loving innocent son suffering in such pain. I can't imagine anything worse! I try to ball my eyes out but can't, I can't imagine the pain he is going through. As a mother I would do anything to stop this, but there's nothing I can do. They're too powerful!"

#### Caritas Update

In 2012, Christian participated in the Rural Development Program run by Caritas Australia. The program offers materials, capital and training that helps farmers in rural areas establish sustainable farms that will produce reliable, profitable and long-term crops.

The program helped the young men secure land to farm, and provided them with seedlings and agricultural training. The farmers have since helped one another to learn and achieve, and are now beginning to reap the rewards of their hard work— a healthy, nutritious new range of fruits in their diets and a steadily increasing income for all their families.

Thank you to everyone who donated to Project Compassion. The total amount raised at St Joseph's was \$393.50. This amount can 'Provide a five-day training course for 10-15 people, so they can learn to raise and sell fish in Nepal' as well as 'Provide training for 2 community relay workers, so they can reach out to communities and help prevent malnutrition in Niger.

# Parents' Guide to Internet Use

### Like the real world the cyber world will never be perfect but parents have the power to reduce the issues significantly

#### Please Remember...

- . The cyber world is a great and safe world; it's how people use it that creates issues
- . My child needs my life skills and adult instincts to help them make sound choices and identify problems
- No program my child will want to use is essential to their development, treat all programs as an added extra, a privilege
- No online decision I make in good faith regarding my children and their safety is a bad one, trust my instincts
- Technology will forever change but our household rules and my protective practices will never change
- · Online dangers and responsibilities are real
- Always weigh up the positives and potential risks when deciding what programs my kids can use
- Encourage the use of technology in a public environment; issues are more likely to happen in private
- Everybody in the house knows I am the one who has the final say regarding technology



- I don't have to be an internet expert only a difigent, loving and sometimes strict parent
- Rules and boundaries I put in place will not stop my child using technology, it will help them use it and avoid the bad stuff
- By being an involved parent I reduce the risk of potential issues
- Using programs that can monitor and filter online content is my right as a parent, I'm not spying on my kids, I'm spying on everybody else
- · Online issues aren't about technology; it's ALWAYS about people
- · Online education should start the second my child types a key

Every time my child logs on they have access to everything the adult world has to offer - I have to be involved - I may be the only line of defence

- 1. Always keep lines of communication open
- 2. Consider monitoring and filtering software
- 3. Take interest and have active involvement with kid's internet use
- 4. Take control of the internet and mobile phone
- 5. Have firm guidelines rules and consequences
- 6. Keep the internet in a public area of the home
