Dear Parents and Carers,

On Tuesday night, eight of our students received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St Nicholas of Myra Catholic Church, Penrith. Rev. Father Peter Williams, Vicar General represented Bishop Anthony Fisher, and assisted by Fr Andrew Fornal OP, confirmed candidates from both Penrith and Kingswood parishes. Our students had participated in preparing for this sacrament by attending Mass each Sunday followed by the sacramental preparation session, for the last seven weeks. Their growth in knowledge and understanding of their faith was evident when they each met with Fr Andrew last Friday. For these students and families, reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation was a meaningful faith experience, which will guide them throughout their lives.



Thank you to Ms Nicholls and Mr Aggar for providing music for the Confirmation liturgy. Thank you to Mrs Wilson for coordinating the Confirmation program. Thank you to our parents who made the commitment to walk the sacramental journey with their child/ren. Not an easy road but one with many blessings on the way.

Next term, I will be on leave for five weeks. For three weeks I will be on pilgrimage with Bishop Anthony. We will be re-tracing the footsteps of St Paul in Greece, Turkey and Rome. The final day of the pilgrimage will be in Assisi, the spiritual home of St Francis and St Clare. Celebrating Mass each day in a church, sacred place or even on a boat, will remind us of the spiritual journey our fathers in faith travelled while spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Gallipoli Cove also features on our itinerary; another sacred place in which to give thanks and pray for the men and women of Australia who lost their lives fighting for our freedom.

Congratulations to Ms Nicholls who will be acting Principal in my absence, supported by Mr Aggar, acting Assistant Principal, Mrs Berg, acting Religious Education Coordinator, Ms Treble, Coordinator 2 and Mrs Aggarwal, acting Coordinator 1. I will return to work on Monday 10th November.

Next Monday we have a special guest at our school. Fiona Scott, MP, will be here to present the Term Awards at our assembly. All welcome!

Our school musical is on Wednesday. There are two sessions, 4pm and 7pm. Come and see how talented our children are and the great work Mr Tim has done in transforming our children into stars! Even if your child is not in it, bring them along and encourage them to participate next year.

Did you Know?.....

Monday September the 8th is celebrated in the Catholic Church as the **birthday of Mary** the mother of Jesus. At our assembly on Monday we shared the gospel of Luke 1:26-38. In it, the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary declaring "Hail Mary, you who are blessed by God".

While at the junior football Grand Finals on the weekend I overheard a parent say "that was a Hail Mary pass!" I don't think he was very happy with his son passing wildly in the wet weather!

Isn't it funny that we hear a Bible phrase about Mary, being used in sport. Some might even be offended by the use of Mary's name in such a manner. So I stopped to think about why a pass would be considered a "Hail Mary" pass? The parent was really *hoping* that his son's team did not drop the ball, so in this sense Mary is associated with **hope**. As we pray the Angelus every day at school, we are placing our hope in Mary to intercede on our behalf to her son Jesus.

Parents – if you have volunteered to be a helper please arrive at the disco at the time you have selected.





Year 4 - iLearn Update

Here are some examples:




Explain Everything is an app that we can use for any Key Learning Area. You can use pictures, videos, text etc. The text can be typed or voice recorded.

Maya's Web Journal explaining how to use different apps.




This is a page from Brock's Web Journal. We use the IPhoto app to record our I-Learn journey.



Verse Speaking Eisteddfod

On Sunday 31st August over 50 of our students competed in the Speech and Drama section of the Penrith Eisteddfod. Looking magnificent in their school uniforms, we all met at The Henry Lawson Club before entering the little theatre out the back where other competitors were already reciting poems and nursery rhymes.

St Joseph's were entered in the Group Presentation of a Poem section where up to thirty people recite a poem together. Our youngest performers from Years 1 and 2 were invited to the stage first. They took us on a dangerous ocean adventure entitled "Shark!" Keeping with the sea theme, Years 3 and 4 were next, with an interesting conversation called "Tide Talk." Years 5 and 6 made a final dramatic statement on stage, performing "In The Forest" about a tree being cut down and all the animals losing their home.

All groups performed with amazing skill and entertained everyone in the audience. The adjudicator commented on our use of expression and the way everyone spoke with the same intention. She was so impressed we were awarded three First places, with marks from 94% to 96%.

A huge thank-you to all the parents for coming along to support our students and also Mrs Jackson, Mrs Nicholls and Mrs Serrao for their help in the day.
