

Message From Mrs Reilly...

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

2018 has been an exciting year with lots of success, fun and learning. I'd like to begin by thanking you for your support and encouragement. It is by working together that we have achieved so much.

Our children want to come to school as evidenced by our Attendance rates - on average 84%. We are currently sitting 5% higher than this time last year. The smiles on their faces when they arrive and during the day are all signs of their happiness.

The launch of PBS4L has been a fantastic success. We have clear expectations about what is expected with students' behaviour. Incidents on the playground and in the classroom have decreased dramatically as we all know how to be safe, respectful learners. Our Kingswood Kindness Days remind us to be kind to each other all the time which has helped to ensure that this is expected.

Success with academic results has also been a milestone for this year. Our NAPLAN growth between Year 3 and Year 5 was well above state average and was one of the highest in the Parramatta Diocese. Early Years Assessment results again showed dramatic improvement and have been applauded by CEDP representatives. PAT-R (which measure comprehension) results are all above average and again have been identified by CEDP as showing great growth.

The school environment has had a lot of money spent on it to ensure that great teaching and learning can take place. The Administration building was painted and recarpeted, the library was painted and new furniture purchased. The MPA was painted, new air conditioners and a new projector installed. The Kindy space was ready to move into at the beginning of the year and new furniture followed soon after. The Stage 2 building work commenced pretty quickly after that and the children were able to move into that building in Term 3 to a building that had good acoustics and flexible learning spaces to enable great learning to take place. A new shade area at Kiss 'n' ride and then the landscaping project which began in Term 4. This project shows both the school and the wider community that we want the very best for our children and are proud of being part of this wonderful school. The sign which helps with communication and the retaining wall/ artificial grass area which will be another space to play will be completed during the holidays. (I did ask for the Dream Field to be extended but apparently the removal of the dirt would have cost \$100,000) The Stage 3 space renovation will hopefully commence in January!!

I would also like to thank all the wonderful staff who make St. Joseph's the fantastic place it is. It is their commitment, professionalism, hard work and caring that enable us to achieve so much. I particularly want to thank the staff who are leaving St. Joseph's for their contributions. Some of you have been at St. Joseph's a long time, others just a year - thank you for sharing with us your gifts and your kindness. We wish you all the very best in your new roles.

At St. Joseph's, students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are being taught explicitly how to be safe, respectful learners in the classroom and on the playground. The Matrix below includes the areas of focus in our PDHPE lessons.

Throughout the year we have been practising playground procedures like packing up our equipment at the bell and lining up in the right place at the right time. We have also been practising our skills in being safe, respectful learners in the classroom.

Teachers provide students with time to practice, prompts and re-teaching opportunities when needed. Teachers focus their praise on positive actions! Students earn 'Joey's' for their grade as a reward for showing these safe and respectful behaviours on the playground.

Leaving St Joseph's

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year.



One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment ie the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

If you know your child will be leaving St Joseph's at the end of the year, apart from Year 6, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Thank you to those families who have paid their school fee accounts.





I love you to the moon and back... that is not true I love you to pluto and back.


